One of Jim's' cherished accomplishments however is being honored to judge the World Championships in Calgary, the AFA Convention, and the International Team Championships in Stoneleigh, England.

Jim currently maintains a full time farrier business shoeing primarily sport horses in Colorado and Florida.

Jim enjoys teaching farriers and veterinarians everything he has learned in his 40 years in the trade, and believes in a simple approach.

Pair of concave hinds, 12" of $\frac{3}{4}$ " x $\frac{3}{8}$ " Concave, Quarter Clipped Bob Punched, Esl 4, 6 nails, Rasping and filing allowed
Width - 5", Length - 5 $\frac{1}{2}$ ", Between Heels 2 $\frac{3}{8}$ "

Forging Class 2 - 60 minutes

Shoe 1 - Bar shoe from Delta 3 front keg, Suitable Nail, Right Fore, 6 nails, must have Center Dot, Rolled Toe
Width 4 $\frac{7}{8}$ ", Length 5 $\frac{1}{8}$ ", Bar 2 $\frac{3}{4}$ "

Shoe 2 - Plain stamped front, Esl 4, Bob Punched Toe Clip, 6 nails, Right Fore
Width 5 $\frac{1}{8}$ ", Length 5 $\frac{1}{4}$ ", Between heels 2 $\frac{1}{4}$ "

DIVISION 2

Speed Forging - 15 minutes

$\frac{3}{4}$ Fullered Front, 6 Nails, Esl 4, Toe Clipped, 12" of $\frac{3}{4}$ " x $\frac{3}{8}$ "

Forging Class 1 - 60 minutes

Pair of $\frac{3}{4}$ fullered fronts with toe clip, 6 nails, ESL 4, 12" of 1" x $\frac{3}{8}$ "

Forging Class 2 - 60 minutes

Pair hunter bar shoes, 6 nails, Esl 4, 14 $\frac{1}{2}$ " of $\frac{3}{4}$ " x $\frac{3}{8}$ " concave

Shoeing Class - 70 minutes

Pair of feet with concave, Toe clipped front and quarter clipped hind, appropriate clips, stock & nails

DIVISION 3

Speed Forging - 10 minutes

$\frac{3}{4}$ fullered front, with toe clip, 6 nails, Esl 4, 12" of $\frac{3}{4}$ " x $\frac{3}{8}$ "

Forging Class 1 - 60 minutes

Pair fullered heart-bar shoes, 6 nails, Esl 4, 15 $\frac{1}{2}$ " of $\frac{3}{4}$ " x $\frac{3}{8}$ "

Forging Class 2 - 60 minutes

To be announced!! No special tools needed. $\frac{3}{8}$ " stock

Shoeing Class - 70 minutes

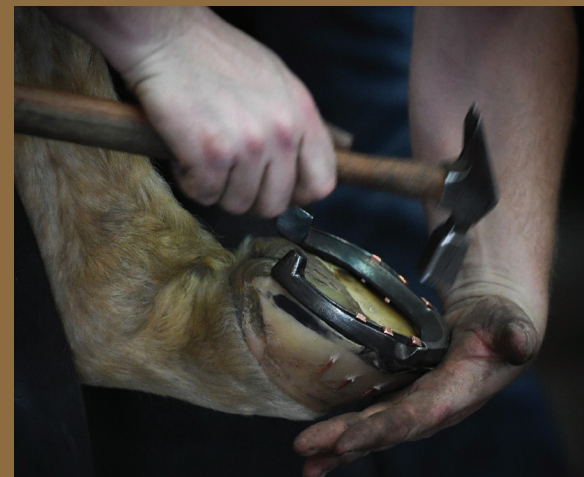
Pair of feet $\frac{3}{4}$ fullered, Toe clipped front and quarter clipped hind, appropriate clips, stock & nails
